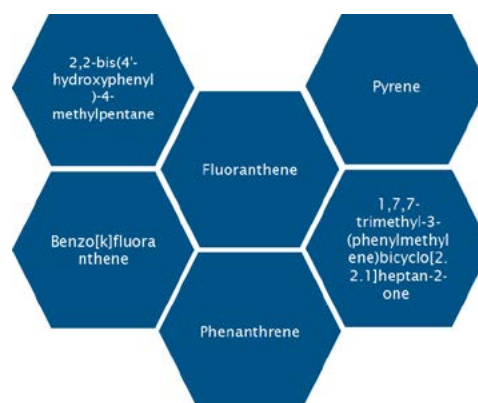




## EU- Update SVHC Candidate List of 197 Substances

On 15 January 2019, ECHA added five new substances to the Candidate List due to the carcinogenic, toxic to reproduction, persistent, bioaccumulative and toxic (PBT) and very persistent and very bioaccumulative (vPvB) properties of the substances. One further substance has been added due to its endocrine-disrupting properties. The new Candidate List added up to 197 after six new substances identified.

# EU – The New Product Safety Marking UKCA

UK government published the design for new product safety marking that would replace the CE marking if UK leaves the EU without a deal.

The CE marking is placed on specific products including toys, machinery and electrical equipment to show the compliance with relevant EU regulatory requirements. The new United Kingdom Conformity Assessed (UKCA) logo will need to be displayed on such items sold in the UK but products sold in EU will still need to be CE approved in the event of a hard Brexit.



In a “no-deal” scenario, it is expected a grace period will be given to manufacturers to adopt the new UKCA marking after 29 March 2019.
